Unusually heavy receipts in New York on Saturday dropped prices \$1 per bbl. eastern cities quoting \$2.75 to \$4.25. at the close. Potato production for the United States as forecast July 1 is 376,987,000 bushels compared with December estimate of last years crop at 430,458,000 bushels.
