The hiblical story of the feeding of children of Israel upon manna heaven during their wandering the) children of israel upon hammer from heaven during their wandering in the wilderness on the way to the land of Canaan does not record a miracle, according to the American consult at Jerusalem. In an official report to the government the consult states that manna is found now in the regions of Upper Mesopolamia and fardistan, and along the Persian frontier. It falls, he says, in the form of a dew during September, etchose the Morember, and lodges upon the leaves of oak trees. It immediately hardens and assumes the form of a grain. Barly in the morning, before the heat of the day, it is gathered by apprending sebects beneath the trees. spreading sheets beneath the trees, which are shaken, and the manna is then collected and stored for winter, to be used as a food, or shipped to Bagdad för sale in the bazaar.

"Fossil Raindrops."

In slabs of Triassic rock little depressions are often seen that have been calfed "fossil raindrops," the idea being that they were formed by showers on muddy sea beaches, and preserved by being covered with a layer of mud at the next high tide.

But lately it has been suggested, in view of observations on a flood plain in the Durn, valley, that the supposed impressions of rain drops may really be due to pittings formed by bubbles in a film of mud at the bottom of shallow water. There have been watched the formation of many pittings, and it has been found that after the mud has dried they exactly resemble "fossil raindrops."
