USED SYSTEM OF HIS OWN

Professor Refused to Allow Proper Spelling to Weigh at All Heavily

Of course "correct" spells "uff" and yet "uff" is not spelled "uff". Such a man, a business man, not to mention school teachers, often find the spelling of the English language a bit troublesome. But here is a one-time university professor and now eminent scientist who not only admits that spelling "gets him rattled," but goes so far as to invent his own form of spelling, which exactly follows out the sound of the word.

Hence we find such sentences as these in a recently issued volume by the anthropological department of the university museum: "His hair waz still black." "The two ritings when they wer don, ov course wer not alike." "Some paragrafs ov his own wer droopt." "I say az nearly az possible becauz—"

The author of the volume, which is the translation of a legend of the Kerechi Indians of Guatemala, is Robert Burkitt, an Englishman.

To Kill Wood Borers in Lumber. Kiln drying is fatal to some if not all the wood-boring grubs, the forest service laboratory of the United States Department of Agriculture at Madison, Wis., has discovered. This fact is of considerable importance to users of ash, hickory, and many other woods which are attacked by insects.

Manufacturers using ash lumber, for instance, are much annoyed by the injury worked by the red-headed ash borer. Air seasoning has no effect on the activities of these grubs, but, according to tests made by the laboratory on wood infested with them, any kiln-drying process which can be considered practical for seasoning ash of any thickness will put an end to the borers.
