CUT SILAGE FINE AND SEAL THE SILO

To prevent decay at the top some To prevent decay at the top some farmers seal the silo with three or four loads of green corn from which the ears have heen removed; some use other sorts of heavy green crops; while still others use sawdust. In Ohio it is common practice to cover Ohio it is common practice to cover the silage with floor sweeping of chaff and grain after threshing. The grain in the chaff will sprout, makes an excellent cover, and excludes the air from the silage. The practice may be good if the grain in the chaff does not have more value as a poutly-feed. In every case, say the Cornell workers, it is advisable to soak the covering thoroly with water and to tramp it regularly for several days after it has been placed in the silo.


