FLYING ABOVE THE CLOUDS

Possible to Experience Every Degree of Fog and Sunshine Within a Few Minutes.

The full majesty of the aerial perspective can only be realized when one is above the clouds and the earth is abut off from view. In flying on an evereast day, when heavy banks of boundous clouds the at 3000 feet, it is possible to experience within a minute or two every degree of fog and sunding. When one is passing into the clouds, the lower surfaces of which are almost perfectly flat, there is an instantaneous transition from shadow to complete atmospheric opacity, similar in appearance to a dense fog similar in appearance to a dense fog at the ground, but differing somewhat from it in feeling, for the interior of a cloud seems to be drier, the air less saturated with water vapor, than fogs which are met with at ses sahore. If the climb is continued a few hundred feet farther, the air-plane passes again into clear air, but linto air now of a clarity and bright-ness worthy of Mediterranean skies and not at all to be compared with the sky at sea level.—Ohio State Jour-

Preserving Fruit in Transit.

In an attempt to evolve methods of preventing the spoilage of fruits and regetables by freezing while in transit or sterage, the Department of Agriculture is conducting thousands of experiments at the Arlington (Va.) laborations, to determine at what temperatures these products freeze. The experimental apparatus, says Popular Mischanics Magazine, consists of a large tank in which brine is circulated, and thermocouples which possess the peculiar property of generating weak and variable currents of electricity and variable currents of electricity when they are subjected to changes on temperature. These variations are registered by delicate meters. So sensitive are the thermocouples that they will detect a difference of tamperature-of 0001 degree. In service, a test specimen of fruit and a thermocouple are placed in one of twelve cups in the lid of the brine-tank.
