TO TEACH PRACTICAL WEATHER FORECASTS
How Farmer Can Bring Science of Meteorology to His Aid Taught in Short Course at Cornell

With the farmer affected as much as any individual by weather change, an increased registration is looked for at Cornell this fall in the short course in meteorology, which was given last year for the first. The language art course is another one which was tried out last winter and was so popular that it is being repeated. The time-tested work in dairy, poultry and other subjects will be continued. The course this year open on November 9 and will close February 22.

New This Year
Two courses which have not hitherto been offered will be given this winter for the first time. The first of these has to do with the rural press, and tells of the relation of country newspapers to the community, the place and purpose of country correspondence, and the value of the local paper to the farmer, both as a source of news and as an agency for advertising.

The other new course is of cooperative marketing and gives the principles underlying the "operatively" selling of farm products, makes a study of various New York cooperative enterprises, and tells the working of the state law governing farmers' co-operation.

Any interested in the short courses will receive a prompt reply to any inquiry addressed to the secretary of the State College of Agriculture at Ithaca, N. Y.

Girls Like Sewing
Of the homemaking work, those carrying on clothing, or sewing projects, are far in the lead with a total of 5,552. This is more than double the number engaged in any other type of work. Gardening leads the list of agricultural projects as far as number of workers is concerned, with 2,679 enrolled. Poultry raising is a close second with 2,385 and potato-growing third with 1,661.

Most of the projects are now nearing completion and the workers who have completed the requirements, including a record on the blanks furnished, are receiving their souvenir "achievement pins." These are presented by the New York State Bankers' Association, thru the State College of Agriculture.

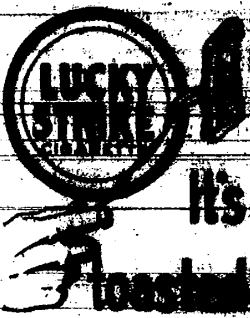
