The index number of the ever-State College of Agriculture. Since then it has risen to 107 in July, 114 in August, and 118 in September. The index number of the average wholesale price of all commodities in the United States was 166 in September; this means that farmers on the average soil products which would have brought \$100 before the war for \$118. They then find that commodities which they could have purchased for 100 before the war will now cost them \$156. They can, therefore, purchase only 76 per cent. as much as normally, or have 76 per cent. of their normal purchasing power. But there has been a slight improvement of late.
