# Farm and Stock Mart

(Washington, D. C., for week ending Jan. 15, 1923.)  
**Live Stock and Meats**  
Chicago hog prices were 36-65c for the week. Beef steers cago \$17.  
Rangers from 25c higher to 25c lower on top and good grades to 40c higher on medium grades. Butcher cows and heifers were 10 and 35c higher respectively, while feeders were 35-40c higher and veal calves 50c lower. Fat lambs were 25-40c lower, feeders steady to 10c higher, yearlings steady and ewes 40c-1 lower. On Jan. 15 hogs were 5-15c lower; beef steers generally steady to 25c lower and fat lambs 25-50c lower. Fat sheep weak to 25c lower. Jan. 15 Chicago prices: Hogs, top, \$8.40; bulk of sales \$7.75-8.25; medium and good beef steers \$7.90-11.50; feeder steers \$6.25-8; \$3.75-10.50; feeder steers \$6.25-8; light and medium weight veal calves \$12.75-14.75; fat lambs \$12.75-14.85; yearlings \$9.25-13; fat ewes \$5-8.35. Stocker and feeder shipments from 12 important markets during the week ending Jan. 5th were: cattle and calves 35,870; hogs 2,252; sheep 23,141. In eastern wholesale fresh meat markets beef ranged from steady to \$2 higher for the week; veal \$1.5 higher on better grades and steady on lower grades; lamb remained practically unchanged. Mutton was \$2 lower on good grades and \$1-2 higher on medium grades. Light pork loins were \$1 lower to 50c higher and on heavy loins steady to 50c lower. On Jan 15 beef was \$1 higher at Boston, steady to slightly higher at Phila. and steady to 50c higher at New York. Other grades steady at New York. Veal was steady at all markets. Lamb was \$1 higher at Phila. and steady elsewhere. Mutton was \$2 higher at Boston, steady to \$1 higher at Phila. and steady at New York. Pork loins were 50c-1 higher at Phila. and other grades steady at New York and Boston. Jan. 15 prices good grade meats: Beef \$14.17, veal \$17-20, lamb \$24-28; mutton \$13-17; light pork loins \$16.50-18; heavy loins \$13-15.

Millfeed markets quiet but firm. Jobbers heavily stocked and discounting prices. Present light operation of flour mills tend to sustain wheat feed prices. Cottonseed meal weak; linseed meal easier. Cornfeeds firm, production good, demand fair. Alfalfa good. Supplies in interior considered normal and storage stocks in excess of those held at same time last year. Receipts and movement good. Quoted Bran \$24.75; middlings \$25; rye middlings \$24, flour middlings \$27 Minneapolis. White hominy feed \$30 St. Louis, \$31.50 Chicago. Yellow hominy feed \$30 Chicago.
