LANE SCHOOL DISTRICT

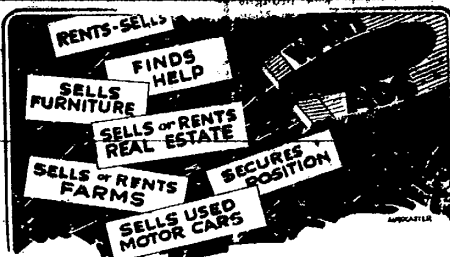
