The big swing for Smith started immediately after he signed the dry repeal bill, but the suprising fact is that virtually every state turned in a comparatively heavy vote for him. This has given political leaders some new food for thought.

It has always been assumed that a "liberal" candidate such as Smith with his state prohibition repeal, would not stand any chance in the small town and rural districts where voters are all supposed to be "dry"—still the votes are in and here for the leaders to study.
