

# Smith Still Going Strong in New York

Ford is the Most Popular Candidate the Country Over, Leading Harding Nearly Two to One in Nation-Wide Straw Vote.

Will the voters of the United States, through straw votes, force Henry Ford onto the Democratic leaders as that party's Democratic candidate in 1924? Will the Democratic leaders ignore the voice of the people and try to win with Governor Al Smith of N. Y. and his liberal views—as expressed in his signing the state prohibition repeal bill recently?

Or—will McAdoo come in as a last minute dark horse and grab the Democratic nomination?—Is Harding assured of the Republican nomination—if Ford is selected by the Democrats?—Will Hiram Johnson or Hoover be the G. O. P. choice in the attempt to hold the solid republican vote if Ford runs for the Democrats?

These and a thousand other questions are the topics of discussion in every community since the Andover News nation-wide Presidential Voting Test has piled up some very interesting figures for political prophets to study.

Through this newspaper's membership in the Publisher's Autocaster Service of New York it is in position to conduct this nation-wide voting test. Balloting started June 1 and will close July 1.

Returns from 24 states received today, at the end of the second week of voting, shows Ford running far in the lead with 73,542 votes to Harding's 32,623. This vote is representative of the small town and rural community choices and is consistent with the big city and larger town face-to-face straw vote now nearing an end as conducted by Collier's National Weekly.

The sixth week of voting as announced by Colliers in this week's issue, June 27-30, shows Ford 64,948 and Harding 39,236. Then comes McAdoo with 15,667; Cox 13,182; Johnson 12,608; Hughes 11,179; Smith 10,623, and Hoover 7,968.

The nation-wide vote of the Andover News indicates that the real issue in our smaller communities is "Ford or Harding?" It will be noticed that more than two-thirds of twenty-four states are for these two the total 180,455 votes cast in leaders. On the other hand the Collier vote (which is representative of the big city and larger town sentiment) shows, after Ford and Harding, a more even distribution of votes to leaders like McAdoo, Johnson, Hughes, Cox, Smith and Hoover. The 27,581 votes piled up for Gov. Smith of New York—and which places him third in the Andover News poll, comes mostly from New York—where 22,032 votes were given him in the lead over both Harding and Ford.

The big swing for Smith started immediately after he signed the dry repeal bill, but the surprising fact is that virtually every state turned in a comparatively heavy vote for him. This has given political leaders some new food for thought. It has always been assumed that a "liberal" candidate such as Smith with his state prohibition repeal, would not stand any chance in the small town and rural districts where voters are all supposed to be "dry"—still the votes are in and here for the leaders to study.

Ford's announcement at Springfield, Mass., last week that he would not be a candidate for the presidency is taken with a grain of salt by both Democrats and Republicans. The straw votes show that he is a serious contender in the public's mind and will force him into the race.

Ford seems equally strong in all parts of the country, as the vote by states shows. If he was on the Democratic ticket and the vote was to be taken today it is possible he would carry some of the regular Republican states.

**DOGS**  
All Dog Licenses Expire on June 30. The 1923 License Fee is Due July 1st  
Every dog must wear a tag of the current dog license year. A dog without a tag is presumptive evidence by law, and no action can be maintained for his injury or destruction. An unlicensed dog may be seized and killed, and the fact that a dog is without a tag is presumptive evidence that the dog is unlicensed.  
Dog licenses must be obtained from the Clerk of the city or town where the dog is harbored or kept.  
License Fees are as Follows:  
Male dog \$2.25  
Female dog 5.25

Spayed female dog ..... 2.25  
These amounts include clerk's fees. No license can be issued for less than the full license fee.  
The owner of a dog who fails or refuses to obtain a license for the dog as required by law incurs a penalty of \$10.00 and costs.  
The assessors of towns and the police departments of cities are required to prepare in June of each year a list of dog owners. The omission of the name of an owner from the assessors' or police list will not excuse the owner from obtaining a license.
