FRANCIS WIXSON DEAD

Francis Wixson was born July 3, 1837, in Steuben Co., N. Y. Later in life he removed with his parents to a farm near Friendship, Allegany Co. where he was living when the Civil War broke out in 1861. He enlisted in Co. C, 85 N. Y. V. and served for more than four years, nearly a year of which was spent in Andersonville and other Confederate prisons, from the effects of which he never recovered. He left the service in 1865, and some time later went to Oil City, Pa., engaged in the mercantile business. Here he met and married Catherine Black, and to them were born the five children who survive. About 1870 he returned to Allegany County.

N. Y., engaged in various occupations until 1898, when he and his family removed to Oregon. He settled near Brockway, Oregon, where his wife was soon laid to rest. In 1906, he removed to Myrtle Creek, Ore., and in 1914 went to Montana, remaining there two years. He was fond of traveling, and spent considerable time near Los Angeles, Cal. Last summer he revisited his boyhood home in New York, going to Kansas to spend the winter where he was stricken down by his fatal illness. He died April 28, being 85 years, 10 months and 25 days old. His daughter, Desda, who reached his side several days before the end came, returned to Oregon with the remains and on May 5th the body was laid to rest beside that of his wife.
Last summer Mr. Wixson passed several days in Andover, guests of his comrades, C. F. Davis and the late U. W. Stratton. He will be remembered by those who met him as a man of pleasing personality and keen intellect.
