Voltaire opposed torture of witnesses, breaking every miserable judge in one famous case, after a fight of many years. He defied Frederick the Great and greater powers, and finally died peacefully in his bed, nearly eighty-five years old, rich in money, adored by the people that drew his carriage thru the streets. He showed the right way to deal with an idea. That was better than poor John Brown of Harpers Ferry, never living to see anything accomplished.

It takes one kind of ability to higher kind to convert or hang those that oppose the idea when it is right.
