Save The Silly American Heiresses

The revolting confession of that unspeakable cad, Count Boni de Castellane, who in a published article tells under his own name how he plotted to marry Anna Gould and her millions, should prove not only a warning to self-respecting American girls—it should provide a guide post for American legislators who have in their power the ability to put an end once and for all time to the deluding of the countrywomen and the exploitation of American fortunes.

There are few people who know the history of the Gould accumulations, and who are familiar with the escapades that have marked the lives of some of the earlier generations who have not regarded the Gould family with a certain measure of regret.
