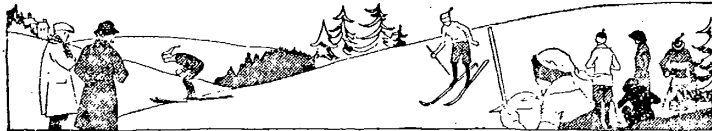

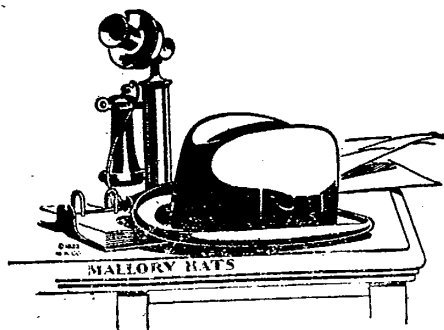

Under Monroe, Florida was added to the United States territory in 1820 by treaty with Spain.
