On comparison to the bride's end

gloves for his ushers. Then the  
groom sees that carriages are pro-  
vided to take the ushers to and  
from the church, and another car-  
riage to take him and his bride from  
the church. Such are the bride-  
groom's duties.

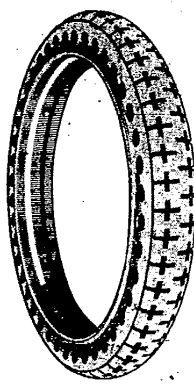

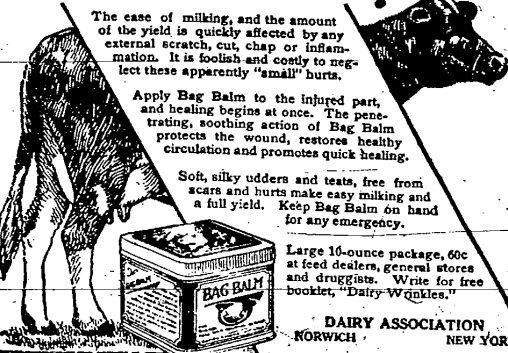
