EVERYTHING FREE AT FARMER'S WEEK

Public invited to Attend All Ses-
sions and to Enjoy Entertainment
and Instruction.

The lectures, demonstrations, con-
ferences and other features of far-
mer's week at the state college at
Ithaca are free and open for the
benefit of every farmer and farm
woman in New York State. The only
exception to this is the students
play, or Kermis, on Friday night,
February 15, at which a nominal ad-
mission is charged.

This play is written and presented
by students, and the small admis-
sion fee goes for the benefit of stu-
dent activities in the college of ag-
riculture.

Other student meetings, such as
the Eastman prize-speaking contest,
are presented without cost.

In addition, motion picture films
are shown every day. Even on the
night of the student play, other en-
tertainment and lecture features are
provided free for those who may not
wish to see the Kermis. Other en-
tertainment features include illus-
trative readings with music, illus-
trated lectures, and a concert by the
Cornell university orchestra.

Special rates to farmers' week are
being offered on several railroads. It
is suggested that those who contem-
plate visiting the state college at
this time will do well to make in-
quiry of their local station agents.

Professor R. A. Felton, Specialist
in Recreation from the state college
of Agriculture at Cornell University,

T. B. COMMITTEE ORGANIZES FOR 1924

The Allegany County Bovine
Eradication Joint Committee met in
Selmont. This committee is com-
posed of S. J. Cleveland, Supervisor from
the town of Alma, Chairman of the
special committee from the Board
of Supervisors on T. B. Eradication,
and Mr. Grant Lynde, Supervisor of
the town of Centerville and the
Farm Bureau directors, Mr. E. R.
Crandall, Andover, and I. D.
Karr, Almond. Mr. E. R. Crandall
of Andover was elected chairman of
the joint committee.

This committee adopted the fol-
lowing resolutions:

WHEREAS, the agricultural Com-
mittee believes that the county has
fulfilled its mission in cleaning up a
herd from T. B. as soon as a herd
has been or is entitled to be offi-
cially accredited.

BE IT RESOLVED that any fur-
ther tests shall be at the owners' ex-
pense under paragraph 6 of the Ac-
credited Herd Plan.

WORLD'S RECORD COW DEAD

Fancher Farm Maxie, world's re-
cord cow, who under test when four
years old made 46.24 pounds of but-
ter and gave 579.10 pounds of milk
in seven days, a record never since
broken, is dead. Her name today
heads the list on the books of the
Holstein-Friesian Association of
America.

Maxie was born and raised on the
farm of A. T. Fancher. At the age
of two years and nine months she
freshened and ten days later start-
ed on her first test, she made almost
26 pounds of butter in seven days
and 39.51 pounds in fourteen days.
At the age of three years, six months
and nine days she was again tested,
and made 33.10 pounds of butter in
seven days winning the association's
prize for milk. Her record test came
the next year.

Maxie leaves three sons, the
greatest average bulls in the world,
who now head the list of the seven-
year old sires on the farm.
