SPECIAL BRIDGE ELECTION

NOTICE is hereby given that a special election will be held on the 21st day of March, 1924, at the Village Hall, in the Village of Andover, N. Y., on the 21st day of March, 1924, from 12 o'clock noon to 6 o'clock P. M., of that day, for the purpose of voting upon the following proposition:

"Shall the Town Board of the Town of Andover, Allegany County, N. Y., be authorized to expend the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) or so much thereof as may be necessary to pay for the cost of constructing a steel and concrete bridge in the main improved highway leading from Andover to Wells, over Dyke's Creek where the same crosses the highway in said Town between the Mac Dean farm residence and the Erie Railroad Company's right of way, and also authorized to borrow upon the faith and credit of said Town of Andover, N. Y., the amount necessary to pay such cost of such construction, not to exceed the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) and issue and sell bonds of said Town upon its faith and credit to pay the cost of such construction or so much thereof as said Board may deem advisable; said bonds to be paid within five years from the date of issue, in five equal annual installments, with interest at a rate not exceeding five per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually, and also authorized to raise annually by tax upon the taxable property of said Town sufficient funds to pay such portion of the cost of constructing said bridge as shall not be otherwise available for that purpose?"

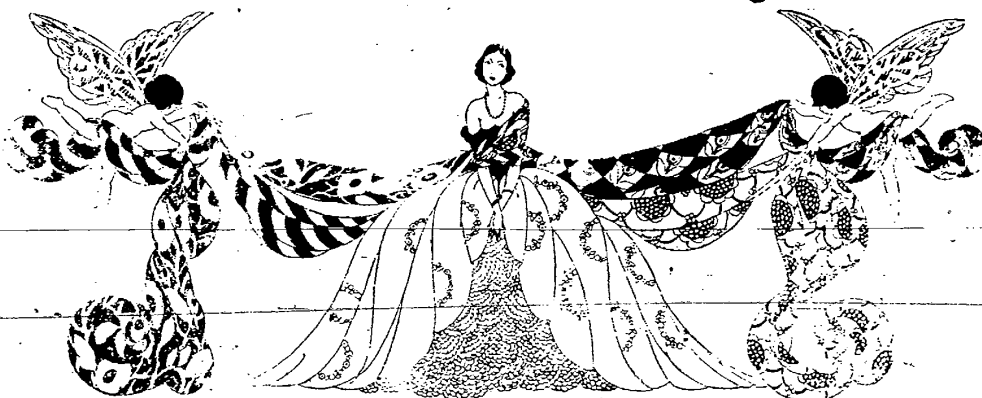
