suant to section 522, Article 9, of

the Conservation Law, the Water

Control Commission will meet in

the Village Hall in the Village of

Andover, on the 22nd day of April,

1924, at 11 o'clock in the forenoon

of that day for the purpose of hear-

ing, municipal corporations or other civil divisions of the State of New York, who have objection to the execution of said plans, in order to be heard thereon, must file such objections thereto in writing in the office of the Water Control Commission in the City of Albany, N. Y., on or before the 21st day of April, 1924. Every objection so filed must particularly specify the grounds thereof.

No person, waterworks or municipal corporation or local authority can be heard in opposition thereto except on objections so filed.

Ordinances and By-Laws of the Village of Andover, Adopted Nov. 25, 1892 With Amendments and Additions to July 1, 1911.

ARTICLE VI

Streets and Sidewalks

Section I. Encumbering Streets and Sidewalks: Any person who shall throw, place or deposit, or permit to remain, in any public street, highway, lane, park or public ground, or on any sidewalk or crosswalk in this Village any stones, brick, wood, lumber, wagon or other vehicle, dirt, ashes, paper, rubbish, fifth or any other material, article or thing whatever, or in any manner encumber, obstruct or enroach upon the same, except as hereinafter provided, shall upon conviction forfeit not less than one nor more than twenty-five dollars and cost, and five dollars and costs for each day such material, article, encumbrance, obstruction or enroachment shall so remain after verbal notice from the Street Commissioner, President or any Trustee to remove same. This section is subject to laws regulating the encumbering of streets when erecting or repairing buildings and the performance of other necessary work.
