"Best Minds" For Davis

Announcement was made this week that John Grier Hibben, who succeeded Woodrow Wilson as president of Princeton University, would vote for John W. Davis and had invited Mr. Davis to speak at Princeton, during the campaign. Dr. Hibben, a life-long Republican, was one of the most prominent of the 31 leading Republican men of letters who signed a joint appeal in 1920 urging the people of the United States to vote for Harding because only by such action could the United States take an active, direct, responsible part in the solution of post war problems and the discharge of its obligation to help secure permanent peace. Among other prominent signers were Herbert Hoover, now secretary of commerce, and Charles Evans Hughes, now secretary of state.

Coincident with Dr. Hibben's decision, comes the announcement that Dr. William C. Thompson, president of Ohio State University, and Everett Colby, former Republican state senator of New Jersey, would support the Democratic candidate.

Repugnance at the carnival of corruption under the past four years of Republican rule and confidence in the courage and ability of John W. Davis is invariably the reason given by the astounding number of life-long Republicans for supporting the Democratic presidential nominee.—Salamanca Enquirer.
