

DENJAMIN FRANKLIN possessed a gifted pen and D some thought he would be called on to write the He was not chosen because it was fear-i led he might put a joke into it. After the constitution it been signed, one of the signers remarked serious-: "Now, we must all hang together," to which Frankn replied: "Yes, or we shall all hang separately." Franklin had a keen sense of humor and he never

Ifailed to rely on it in times of great stress. He lived to be 84 years of age. A short time before his death insisted on getting up to have his bed made, expressing the desire "to die in a decent manner." Franklin was the first American optimist because \$1.00 he always saw the "bright side" of every question. He

was not a dreamer, but a doer, and has been called a many-sided man because no other man of his time could do so many things well.

To Franklin's trait of optimism might be traced he reason for much of his success. Men who expect good results, not bad, are much more likely to see their efforts succeed. Men who have a happy outlook upon life are much more valuable to the community. the state and the nation.

Franklin had ample reason to be discouraged. The provoking acts of the British kept the American colonies in a turmoil and Franklin was always in the front ranks, fighting the cause of the people.

He was great because he served others. He lived not for himself alone, but seemed obsessed with the dea of bettering the conditions of the people. H romoted the first public schools, backed the first street! paving project and otherwise showed his deep interest in the welfare of the community.


