





Your used car has seemingly L different values because competitive dealers are bidding to sell you a new car.

Your used car has only one fundamental basis of value: what the dealer who accepts it in trade can get for it in the used car market.

The largest trade-in allowance which is offered on your used car is not necessarily the best deal for you. Sometimes it is; but sometimes it is not.

An excessive allowance may mean that you are paying an excessive price for the new car in comparison with its real value.

Judge the merits of the new J car in comparison with its price, including all delivery and finance charges. Then weigh any difference in allowance offered on your used car.
