It is best to plow corn stubble so that the furrow cut is one-half or one-third of the width of the distance between rows. The first 1 row should be as close to the stub ble row as possible, then it is capie to turn the stubble under with the next furrow.

A trash wire also helps. usually is about eight or ten feet of number nine wire hitched to convenient point on the front of the plow. Trash wires on gang plows have been found to be more effective than chains because they not clog so easily. When the free end of the wire drags thru the furrow slice it has enough tension hold stubble and corn refuse down so that it will be covered completely by the furrow. Additional wires are sometimes used to advantage, in the same way, by attaching them to the beam, clevis and evener. For Walking Plows A chain is btter than a wire on
