Walnut Sweet Potatoes Peel and boil till tender 12 -weet potatoes, cut them in quarters and place them in a baking dish; basic them with butter and sprinkle with sugar and walnut meats coarsely chopped. Butter nats a e delicious I or walnuts may be used. Put the dish in the oven until nicely brown-

Crustless Cocoanut Pie Beat two eggs, add two tablespoons of sugar and four tablespoons! of flour smoothed with a little milk, one cup of shredded cocoanut, onefourth teaspoon of salt, one-half teaspoon of vanilla. Put into a pone pan and bake. Put into a moderate oven and when you can insert knife into the side without its sticking the pie is done and will have formed a crust. This is quickly made and is delicious.

Tomato Mincemeat Chop one peck of green tomatoes or put them thru the food chopper with the coarse grinder; drain off the juice and add as much water as juice, five pounds of brown sugar, two pounds of seeded raisins. Cook this slowly until tender then add two tablespoons each of cloves, cinamon, and alspice, two tablespoons c salt and one cup of vinegar. Boil 45 minutes and add six large sour apples cropped, when the apples are done the mincemeat is ready for the cans. Seal while hot. In mak-I ing any food which calls for spices it is best to add a little at a time till the right proportions are reached. Some prefer to use white su-

Twenty-five peaches peeled and cut in small pieces, the pits of 18 of them cut each in three! pieces, a bowl and a half of sugar. Cook till thick and add a small bottle of marachino cherries cut two and seal in glasses or small cans.






