Declares Beer Law Not Constitutional

Greeley, Colo., May 12.—Sweeping aside the opinions of some of the ablest constitutional lawyers in congress, who aided in drafting the 3.2 per cent. beer bill, District Judge Claude C. Coffin has declared its passage in violation of the Constitution.

In his decision yesterday which denied the Greeley Elks Club and Fred N. Fetch, cafe owner, a writ of mandamus which they sought to compel the Greeley city council to issue beer permits, Judge Coffin said the congressional declaration that
