**Ford V-8 Sales Show Increase**

Detroit, Mich.—Sales of the Ford eight-cylinder cars and trucks in the United States for the month of June, just ended, exceeded those of June a year ago by 19.4 per cent. It was the biggest month in eight-cylinder car sales since the Ford Motor Company began producing them over a year ago.

Another evidence of the growing popularity of the eight-cylinder car is reflected in the sales of Ford cars for the month of June in Wayne county, Michigan. County registrations show that 2,555 Ford V-8's were delivered to customers during the month. This is an increase of 25 per cent. over the May sales. It is more than the combined month's sales in the county of the two nearest other makes.
