

County Sealer of Weights and
Measures, A. W. Corwin, reports
some of the principal requirements
of recent changes in the New York
State coal law and regulations pertaining thereto, effective Oct. 1st, 1933, to be as follows:
Coal and coke shall be sold by weight. The weighing shall be done
by a licensed weighmaster of the state of New York. This license is for the individual weighmaster and shall be kept at the place where the State oal and coke shall be weight ed on sealed scales located in the State of New York. Each delivery must be accompanied by a weight ticket showing the weight of the coal, the name of the purchaser.
