



Melt sugar in a small, heavy skillet over moderate heat, and continue heating until a smooth. ligh brown syrup is formed, stirring constantly. Remove from fire and add water: then cook until caramel is entirely dissolved. Place 11/4 tabléspoons of caramel syrup in each custard cup. Add chocolate to milk and heat in double boiler. When chocolate is melted, beat with rotary exc bester until blended. eggs, sugar, and salt; add chocolate mixture gradually, stirring until sugar is dissolved. Add vanilla and pour into prepared custard cups. Place in pan of hot water and bake in slow oven (825° F.) 60 minutes, or until knife inserted


