Cats and Mice

Don't neglect to start your trapping early in the season. Every air you kill off now will make many less next winter. If you have a few old traps keep them set around in the places they frequent, look at them occasionally and see that they are working. Some people have been catching about a pair a week on an average this summer and they should not therefore, be over run this fall.

All kinds of traps to choose from at 2 for 5c for mice and 10c each for rats. If they are too clever to get caught, feed them Rat Rid or Rat Nip—a poison that will clean them out.
