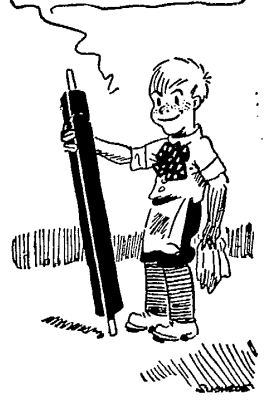
At the business meeting, Howard Perry was re-elected president; Mrs. Elina Thompkins, secretary-treasurer and Mrs. Elwin Cook in charge
