# Handling Tomatoes

Largest Early Crop and

No wonder thinking economists, farmers, editors hardened proved superior to southern-grown plants and to home-grown i plants subjected to more severe hardening in yield of early tomatoes! and in total yield in tests conducted on the grounds of the State Experiment Station at Geneva last season. In summarizing the results, Professor Sayre states that "While one year's results are not sufficient i conclusive evidence, the marked superiority of the moderately hardened and younger plants is in agreement with previous experience here

and at other experiment stations. "In comparing locally grown vs. southern-grown plants, the results will always depend upon the age' and condition of the plants, methods of packing, and promptness of shipping and in having the land ready so that the plants can be transplanted to the field promptly when they are received. Lack of any one these important conditions may result in disappointing returns. Generally, the grower has better control over these conditions if he obtains' his plants locally, and there is the further advantage that New York grown plants are likely to be freer
