For instance, a large part! of the money spent yearly for eggs can be saved, if quantities of eggs are bought now when prices are lower, and stored in waterglass for ter use. Absolutely fresh eggs stored this way keep their flavor, whip well, and can be satisfactorily cooked in almost every way but

Test eggs of doubtful freshness n one of the following ways: (1) Place them, one at a time, in a quart of water to which a third of a cup egg appears clear inside, with air cell no larger than a nickle. This method, called candling, is best done


