"Shall the Village Board be authorized if such allotment is ebtained to issue and sell bonds of the Village to the amount of Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000.00) and pledge the faith and credit of the Village to the payment thereof, such bonds to be payable One thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) of the principal one year from the date of issue and One thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) of the principal annually thereafter until the issue is full paid, with interest at three-per cent (3%) per annum payable semi-annually?"
