LOW COST MEATS

What are the low-cost cuts of meat and how can they be "dressed up?" is a question which often puzzles cooks, both old and new.

Less expensive roasts are shoulder of lamb or pork, breast of lamb, a cured shoulder of pork, or spareribs. These may be delicious when boned and stuffed with a bread dressing seasoned with celery, sage, cranberry, onion or apple.

To stuff a shoulder, place the dressing inside the boned shoulder, roll the shoulder compactly, sew or skewer it in place, and sprinkle the outside of the roast with salt, pep-per and flour. Lay the stuffed shoulper and nour. Lay the student shoulder, fat side up, on a rack in a roasting pan. Do not add water and do not cover the pan.
