

TO THE VOTERS OF ANDOVER CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Board of Trustees regret that the time between its election to make a thoro study of building and maintainance costs and the facilities needed and was therefore obliged to proceed along the line of the general accepted theory of what was expected. Apparently the plan as generally understood by the voters was

to use the new part of the present building and to erect a new building to cover the balance of the district's needs. The Department of Education approved this plan providing the old building was used for high school pupils as it would not consent to the lower grades being placed on the second floor. At the same time it expressed the opinion that it was false economy not to build the new building of sufficient size to accommodate the entire school. The Board, however, felt that the voters expected the former plan and have been working along that line. Since the last meeting, the Board has been urged by voters

from all parts of the district to give consideration to constructing the new building of sufficient size to accommodate the entire school while the Federal grant of 45 per cent of the total cost is still available. Undoubtedly it will not be available at a later date. The Board feels that it should not ignore these appeals and

since the last meeting has made an extensive study of the comparative cost in building, maintainance, etc., of the two plans. It finds that in order to make the entire Federal grant of \$171, 000.00 available in case it should be needed will require an additional bond issue of \$28,500.00. Any surplus remaining would be used

to retire some of the bonds. The State would pay 25 per cent of the bond issue, leaving \$21,375.00 as the net cost to the taxpayers, providing the whole amount was necessary, or an annual cost of about \$1,000.00, including principal and interest, over the period of the bond issue. The architect's estimate of the total cost is considerably under this amount. If the larger school is built, the district would save the cost of heating the old building, janitor, insurance, repairs, maintainance,

etc., but there would, of course, be some increase in these items in a larger building. From the best estimates the Board has been able to obtain, the saving in fuel and janitor work alone would offset the \$1,000.00 per year required to pay for the larger building. In addition, the cost of remodeling the old building would be saved as well as a good many repairs which will be needed shortly. The Board also convinced that there would be considerable saving in the operation of the school and its efficiency be greatly increased. The budget as prepared by School District No. 1 took into account the larger cost of maintaining two schools and so far as cost is concerned it is largely a matter of whether the money is to be spent to pay the additional cost of operating two schools or to pay for the additional cost of the larger building. The Board is convinced that the annual cost to the taxpayers and the tax rate will be no more, and mahably lear, by erecting the larger building. In view of the above information which the Board believes to

be correct, and the further fact that it is being urged by a good many texpeyers to give consideration to the larger huilding, it believes it to be its duty to submit the matter to the voters for their decision as to which program they wish the Board to follow. Accordingly, it has called a meeting of the voters to be beld October 22nd, 1938 between the hours of 7 and 9 o'clock p. m.,

for the purpose of voting upon the proposition of increasing the bond issue to cover the additional cost of the larger building and any additional land which may be required. While the Board is of the opinion that the larger building is desirable in the interest of economy and efficiency, it wishes to as-
