

He has been a gold miner, a cow puncher, a newspaper reporter, an editor, and a college professor! and he has spent years roaming around [Europe, Asia, Africa, Alaska, Australia, and the islands of the Seven Seas. He toured India with the Prince of Wales and was one of the first Americans over to be given permission to enter the wild country k Afghanistan.

He formerly taught Public Speaking at Princeton University, and held is now probably the best known speaker living. He not only breadcasts the day's news to relliens of listorpore in America, but the raice L ocircles the globe. He has an apartment of their






