



Again, 22 years later, in the year 1940, mothers of yesterday find the poppies blowing "row on row" in Flander's Field over the heads of their young sons and pray that their daughters will not have to send their sons of today to make new white crosses upon that field already far too full to consider adding practically another generation to its popularity.
