

Any of the following fruits or combinations of fruits may be used: Two cups of sliced peaches or pears, either fresh or canned; or 8 halves of fruit; 2 cups of sliced, fresh apples; 4 slices of canned pineapple and maraschino cherries; 16 halves of apricots, fresh or canned; 12 halves of dried cooked apricots and 6 cooked prunes, seeded and halved; any fruit with halves of walnuts, pecans or blanched almonds. to answer the complaint in this ac-
