**Town and Village Tax Rates Show Increases**

22 Towns and 10 Villages to Have Higher Rates in 1941. Andover's Rate in Village; 12c Town

State, county and town rates for local government costs paid early in 1941, made public Tuesday by Supervisors Clifford G. Perkins, Clarksville, and G. Perkins, Clarksville, and 22 towns and villages, increases in the rates prevailing over the rates prevailing a year ago. Only six towns show rates were fixed a year ago. The villages, Canaseraga and Belfast, will the willing taxpayers over what he paid early in 1940. Increases in general area part at least to increases in general fund and welfare fund budget for the coming year by the Board of Supervisors county's legislative body. The county rate for this year is \$1,000 of assessed value compared with \$9.04 one year ago. There is a good reason for the largest increase in any town this year. In Rushville the rate will be \$24.38 this year, an increase of \$20.56 last year, an increase of \$1,000. But Rushford will pay some \$2,000 toward the bonds owed the state in construction of the first state highway in Allegany county and will save principal and interest on the bonds.

The next largest increase in town is New Hudson, \$3.00 increase is \$2.45; Canaseraga, \$1.06; Alfred, \$1.06; Alma 60c; Amity 14c; Andover 12c; Belfast 4c; Birdsall 8c; Canandaigua 15c; Centerville 15c; Coxsack 53c; Hume 21c; Lodi 19c; Wellsville 12c.

Increases in rates with are not quite so pronounced as paying over one dollar they are Wellsville, \$1.71; \$1.28. Other villages have rates are Alfred 97c more; Belmont 24c; Andover 13c; Birdsall 13c; Fillsburg 13c; Richburg 42 cents.

The town of Allen will have the largest tax rate cut in among the six towns that a lower rate than one year ago there is \$23.82 or more than one year ago. Other are: in the town of Boylston, \$1.05; Clarksville, \$1.05; Granger, 10c. The rate is \$12.87, exactly the same as one year ago.

Of the two villages that lower rate this year that saving in Canaseraga will be \$1,000 and in Friendsville \$500.
