The above Regulations should be clear to everyone. If not, kindly ask one of your Air Raid Wardens to explain them. It is important that you understand them thoroughly, and at once. Another Blackout may follow soon. We will look forward to your observance of these Regulations—and will appreciate your cooperation.

PENALTIES

REMEMBER - Keep household and store lights OUT until the All-Clear. Pay no attention to street lights.

Any person who violates the New Blackout Regulations is subject to a fine not to exceed \$5,000.00, or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both, for each offense. He is also subject to immediate exclusion from the Eastern Military Area. (Title 18, Section 97A, United States Code.)

REMEMBER — Keep household and store lights OUT until the All-Clear. Pay no attention to street lights.
