WE HAVE been asked: How can we bring in more scrap when we cleaned up everything last fall? To which we can only answer that if you did a thoro job last fall, picking up every bit of scrap iron, etc., us who thought we had done a good job then have since come across bits of iron, etc., that could be added to the national scrap pile. And we do know that on many premises there is still considerable quantities of scrap.

Every pound of scrap iron, steel, copper, brass, bronze, tin and aluminum is needed for the war production program. A handful of old bolts, a broken) stove lid, an old plow point, a worn out tool, a stove that has outlined its usefulness, a broken kettle, worn out machine part, all of these are valuable in the war effort. What-you have to give may not! amount to much by itself. But added to similar small amounts from hundreds of other homes and farms, it will make a machine gun, a shell casing, a vital part of a sub-chaser, or some other essential war




