

It is best to have shelves just the |right height for different sized| jars or eans, with about a two- Order FLOWERS Here inch space above the jars to allow for air circulation and convenient handling. Set the shelves labout 91/2 inches apart for quarts and about 7% inches apart for pints. Tin cans may be piled Jone on top of the other to save

Arrange the jars on the shelves so that last year's food is moved first. If shelf space is at a premium and you have to store filled jars in boxes, be sure they are kept in a cool, dark and dry
