ANSWER. Uranium is found in minerals which are fairly widespread in the earth, though in most places the uranium is in relatively small amounts. There are about six minerals in which the proportion of uranium is high, and these minerals form the ores of uranium when they are in large enough quantities to be economically mined.

Carnoeite has more than 50 per cent uranium oxide in it. Another important mineral containing uranium is pitchblende, which is also a source of rad-Pitchblende has the color and appearance of pitch, while carnoite is a powdery yellow to miners.—Dr. Earl T. Apfel, geologist.
