Proper Care Extends

Service of Silk Umbrellas

Some persons still have silk umbrellas, oiled or plain, and will be interested in their proper care to insure continued service. For a plain silk umbrella, a soft cleaning cloth should be used, and grease spots (from car or road) can be removed with any grease solvent. The same treatment is effective for some rayons; however, if the rayon is an acetate, a cleaning fluid containing

acetone must not be used. Oiled silk or rayon umbrellas may be cleaned by sponging with a damp cloth, rinsing, and drying in the shade away from the heat. Use soap sparingly and never press. Because they stiffen and crack easily, oiled silk and other transparent umbrella materials must be handled carefuly in cold weather.

Silk umbrellas dry out when not DDT—a name derived from the in use, so if there's a dry spell for brella out and wet it under the shower or sprinkler occasionally. All umbrellas should be thoroughly dry before being closed and put away. This is especially true of rayon ones because rayon is weak when damp. Never roll up an umbrella and put

The Black sea has played a significant role in world affairs, economic and military, since Jason came this way in search of the Golden Fleece.

Colonists, pirates, traders and warriors have had a share in its fortunes. In different wars, varying international alignments of the Black sea peoples have altered the course fought the Russians in this area. The long and bitter siege against the Russian base of Sevastopol in 1854when the Germans made their battering attacks on that city from November, 1941, to July, 1942.


