> Mr. Klinger emphasized the need of funds in relating that patient care of the past year had even exceeded the amount raised

in the county. "We have this past year," Mr. Klinger explained, "given aid to about 20 victims of infantile paralysis. Some of this has been costly orthopedic treatments and down to the lesser expenses of the braces, shoes and other equipment that is given by the county association." It was also reported that a grant of \$2,000 from the National Foundation was asked by the local organization for maintenance of patients this year. "I believe these figures speak for themselves in the work that has been done and we are still doing in the county," Mr. Klinger added. "We hope we will not experience another epidemic of this dread disease, -but we stand ready in any circumstance of such reoccurrence."

Mrs. Carol Carpenter, County Public Health Nurse, spoke in behalf of her work with the patients. She discussed the need for certain pieces of equipment aid in reconstruction cases and related that generally most the patients were definitely improving. Ten cases of polio were reported last year and 44 cases in 1944
