## **ADMINISTRATION** BOARD OF EDUCATION

After an interesting visit with Mr. William Alderson on the subject of the Board of Education I decided to run a series of four articles on "School Administration," first of which concerns the main governing body, the Board of Education.

Every year at the annual meeting held the first Tuesday in July a new member is elected to the board for a five year term. The board is an unpaid organization set up to administer and provide for the school. In 1938 a complete new board was elected for the new centralized school. Mr. S. B. Crandall, Mr. M. V. Lynch, Mr. A. D. Fuller, Dr. J. R. Common and Mr. Lloyd Mead constituted the original board. Mr. William Alderson was elected clerk of the board.

The present board: Mr. S. B. Crandall, the present president of the board, was one of the original members elected in 1938 and has done a fine job.

Mr. M. V. Lynch, the other remaining member of the original board, was also elected in 1938 and has been faithfully carrying out board duties ever since.


