



Dies Suddenly New Andover Police Set-up suddenly at her home on Dyke

At the annual meeting of the Andover Village Board held Monday evening, the village police set-up was discussed at length and a new police proposition made which should work out for better and more efficient police protection.

> Officer Albert Rogers will continue as Andover police with an annual salary of \$3,000 for which he is to work a 48hour week and furnish and maintain his own car and uniforms without further remuneration. The hours of duty are to be staggered at his discretion for the best interests of the village so that no one, not even the board itself, will know just when or where he is liable to appear. The system of staggered police hours has been working out very successful in several other Allegany county villages similar to ours with the advantages offsetting by far its disadvantages.

The 48-hour week as village police is to be worked entirely within the corporate limits of the village. Any highway patrol duty which Officer Rogers may do outside the village limits will be done in his capacity of constable for the Town of Andover and such service will be the responsibility of the Town of Andover and have no bearing on his hours of work for the village.
