



# Notice to Gas Lonsumers

We have been advised by the Public Service Commission that they will allow some relaxation in the restrictions on new gas space heating which have been in effect for over a year. These relaxations will become effective on July 1, 1949. We will be allowed to add six hundred new space heating consumers to our lines.

There are certain things we think all prospective new space heating consumers should know.

1. It will be necessary for all new space heating customers in the future to make written application for such service, even though already a consumer of gas for other purposes.

It will be necessary to have the Company's written approval of the application before we can supply such new service

We shall be glad to entertain your application for new gas heating service at any time, and application blanks are available at all of our offices. However, we do not expect to be able to give written approval for several weeks yet, until we have a definite written order from the Public Service Commission.

4. For those eligible to receive new gas heating service, approvals will be made in the order of the receipt of our first inquiry from the applicant.

5. There will be a limit on the size of heating loads which will be eligible under these new relaxed rules, and all customers contemplating new gas heating for commercial use or other similar size loads should inquire at our nearest office for full par-

6. Until July 1st, 1949 there will be no change in the restrictions which have been in effect.

The only restrictions on the use of gas which have been in effect have been those in regard to new space heating uses, and all other uses of gas are still entirely unrestricted.

The Company is disappointed that its request for the complete removal of all restrictions on gas heat was not approved.

We want to express our appreciation to all of our consumers and prospective consumers for the patience which they have shown during the period of restrictions, and assure all of you that we shall make every effort to have these few remaining restrictions terminated as quickly as possible.
