

Number of Constellations

Before 1930 there was some confusion about the number of constellations and their exact boundaries. but in that year the International Astronomical Union officially defined them and set their number at 88. Of these, 48 go back to ancient times. They include such familiar ones as Orion, Perseus, Cassiopeia. the twins, the lion, the great and small bears, the bull, the swan, etc. The others have been added mostly since 1600. Some of the modern constellations were adopted to fill in the far southern sky, not visible from countries in southern Europe and Asia where the older names probably originated. Others were given to areas in the northern sky containing only faint stars, with which the ancients had not

Cooking in the Future

One big improvement in the electric range will be automatic surface cooking, an appliance manufacturer predicts, which will make possible cooking without watching. Food will be cooked on surface units that will be regulated by the temperature control, just as are ovens in today's ranges. Surface units now are keyed to the rate of heat delivered to the cooking utensil rather than to the temperature which actually cooks the food. Temperature regulated surface cooking will mean vegetables and other foods will continue to cook at their proper rates, and will not be burned even though the water should boil away. Even though water will be initially a means of controlling the degree of heat for vegetable cooking, the temperature will not become excessive in the event the water is all boiled away


