Glazed Nutmeats

This year when you make your holiday sweets, try glazing black walnuts, hickory nuts, or buttercups of sugar, 1 cup of water, day, Nov. 18, starting at 1:00 p. the mixture fairly brisk for 12 mont Road. minutes (310 degrees F.) with out stirring.


